37th Annual Chestermere Country Fair Red Ribbon Competition

2026 Categories, Classes & Rules

Theme: The Horse

IMPORTANT GENERAL RULES

IMPORTANT – GENERAL RULES - Please read carefully

1. This is an open fair. Entries will be accepted from outside of Chestermere and Rocky View County.
2. It is up to the entrant to read all rules and regulations and ensure their class is available to be entered.
3. Abuse of our volunteers will not be tolerated, and will result in the immediate disqualification of any entries and you will not be allowed to enter in the Red Ribbon competition the following year.
4. The Red Ribbon Coordinator's decision on any regulation or rule discrepancy is final.
5. ALL ENTRIES in Red Ribbon classes must be received at the Chestermere Recreation Centre on Friday, September 11, 2026 between 11:00 am and 6:00 pm. All entries must have an entry form. The doors to the curling rink close promptly at 5:30 pm to further entries. If you are already inside, you will have until 6:00 pm to get your entries to the receiving desk.
6. Youth may enter the closest class above their age group (Adult or Youth) if that Red Ribbon class is not available for their age.
7. Official entry tags must be used. Please state the Class Number, Item Description and Exhibitor's Name. Entry tags may be tied or taped on the item. Entry tags will be available at various locations in Chestermere in August, please see our website or social media for locations.
8. No ribbons, exhibits or prizes may be removed before 3:30 pm on Saturday, September 12, 2026.
9. Entries winning special prizes will be tagged and prizes, not ribbons, may be collected starting at 11:00 am at the Red Ribbon Front Desk using the "Take to Front Desk" sticker found with the entry. A few categories will have the prize displayed with the entry. Prizes not collected by 4:30 pm on Saturday, September 12, 2026 will be forfeited.
10. All entries MUST BE REMOVED ONLY between 3:30 pm and 4:30 pm on Saturday, September 12, 2026. NO EARLIER THAN 3:30 pm. NO EXCEPTIONS.

11. The Rocky View Chestermere Ag. Society is NOT RESPONSIBLE for any articles left on the grounds or in the facilities after 5:00 pm on Saturday, September 12, 2026.
12. All entries remain the property of the exhibitor. Any entry remaining after the show will be disposed of at the discretion of the committee.
13. You may only enter an exhibit ONCE in one fair. You CAN NOT enter an item that you have already entered in a previous Chestermere Country Fair Red Ribbon Competition again. If it is found that you are entering something that has previously been entered, ALL of your entries will be disqualified for that year.

JUDGING AND PRIZES

1. Trophies and some special prizes will be awarded on Fair Day Saturday, September 12, 2026 at 11:00 am sharp in the curling rink. Numerous donor prizes, which are not indicated, will be distributed at the discretion of the Red Ribbon Committee.
2. Cash prizes or other prizes (EXCLUDING RIBBONS AND EXHIBITS) may be claimed anytime from 11:00 am to 4:30 pm on Saturday, September 12, 2026 at the Red Ribbon Front Desk in the curling rink.
3. Competition judging starts Friday, September 11, 2026 at 7:00 pm at the Chestermere Recreation Centre for all Sections of the Red Ribbon Competition.
4. Trophies - The Family Grand Aggregate Trophy will be awarded to the family with the most overall points in ALL classes of the Red Ribbon Competition. Trophies are also awarded for the most points in each Section. Points will be awarded as follows: First Place = 3 points, Second Place = 2 points and Third Place = 1 point. The name of the winning family or individual and the year of competition will be added to the trophies on permanent display at the Chestermere Rec Centre.
5. First, second and third-place ribbons will be awarded to all classes in the Red Ribbon Competition.
6. All categories will be judged by qualified and experienced judges chosen by the Red Ribbon Committee.
7. The Chestermere area school with the most student entries in this year's competition will be awarded a certificate and their name will appear on the plaque.
8. Other prizes may be awarded, but have not been confirmed at the time of printing this booklet. Please watch our website and Facebook page for additional prize announcements.
9. This is an open fair. Entries will be accepted from outside Chestermere and Rocky View.
10. It is up to the entrant to read all rules and regulations and ensure their class is available to be entered.
11. Abuse of volunteers will not be tolerated and will result in immediate disqualification of entries.
12. The Red Ribbon Coordinator's decision on any regulation or rule discrepancy is final.
13. Official entry tags must be used and attached to all exhibits.
14. Youth may enter the closest class above their age group if a specific youth class is not available.
15. No exhibits, ribbons or prizes may be removed before designated release times.
16. All entries remain the property of the exhibitor.

JUDGING AND PRIZES

1. Competition judging begins Friday evening.
 2. First, second and third place ribbons may be awarded.
 3. Aggregate trophies may be awarded based on points accumulated.
 4. All categories will be judged by qualified judges selected by the Red Ribbon Committee.

SECTION 1 – BAKING

Rules

1. All general fair rules apply.
2. Entries not conforming to class descriptions will not be judged.
3. All exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor.
4. No commercial mixes or fillings unless specified.
5. Commercial and professional bakers are not eligible.
6. Include pertinent information on entry tags.
7. Unless otherwise stated, display all smaller items on a disposable white plate in a clear plastic bag.

Granny Jen’s Blueberry or Saskatoon Muffin Recipe

Wet ingredients

1 cup oatmeal
1 cup buttermilk or plain yoghurt or, 1 cup regular milk with 1 tbsp lemon juice
½ cup oil
1 egg beaten
1 tsp vanilla

Dry ingredients

1 cup flour (white)
½ tsp baking soda
1 tsp baking powder
1 tbsp grated orange or lemon rind. Or ½ tsp orange flavouring
1/3 cup brown sugar
½ cup chopped pecans (walnuts/almonds work too)
Put in a large bowl. Then add the fruit.
1 cup blueberries or Saskatoons
Toss to coat berries with dry
Pour liquid ingredients over, stir gently.

Mix wet into dry. *** If a bit too dry just add a bit more buttermilk or yoghurt or water.
You can make ahead of time, just don’t add the baking powder to the wet ingredients until just before combining.
Bake 25-30 mins at 350 degrees F, makes about 12 large muffins.

2. Entries must not have been entered in previous Chestermere Country Fairs. All exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor and original photo, not a photo of a photo.
3. Entries from commercial establishments and professionals are not eligible. Indoor and Outdoor Market products may not be entered into the Red Ribbon Competition.
4. All photos must be matted or mounted on stiff cardboard with no photo dimension greater than 13 inches (33 cm) excluding mat or cardboard excluding Junior Photography (see rules 9 & 10).
5. No glass.
6. Photo dimensions may be smaller than 13 inches (33 cm) and may be produced from a 35 mm or digital camera.
7. Photos including modifications of that photo may be entered in only one class (e.g. same photo may not be in b/w and colour categories). A group is considered more than one.
8. Youth Photography - photos must be 4 x 6" and mounted on 5 x 7" poster board or stiff construction paper. No frames
