## IMPORTANT - General Rules

1. This is an open fair. Entries will be accepted from outside of Chestermere and Rocky View.
2. It is up to the entrant to read all rules and regulations and ensure their class is available to be entered.
3. Abuse of our volunteers will not be tolerated, and will result in the immediate disqualification of any entries and you will not be allowed to enter in the Red Ribbon competition next year.
4. The Red Ribbon Coordinator's decision on any regulation or rule discrepancy is final.
5. ALL ENTRIES in Red Ribbon classes must be received at the Chestermere Recreation Centre on Friday, September $6^{\text {th }}$ between 11:00 am and 6:00 pm. All entries must have an entry form. The doors close promptly at 5:30 pm.
6. Youth may enter the closest class above their age group (Adult or Youth) if that Red Ribbon class is not available for their age.
7. Official entry tags must be used. Please state the Class Number, Item Description and Exhibitor's Name. Entry tags may be tied or taped on the item. Enty tags will be available various locations in Chestermere in August, please see our website or social media for locations.
8. No ribbons, exhibits or prizes may be removed before $3: 30 \mathrm{pm}$ on Saturday, September $7^{\text {th }}$.
9. Entries winning special prizes will be tagged and prizes, not ribbons, may be collected starting at 11:00 am at the Red Ribbon Front Desk using the "Take to Front Desk" sticker found with entry. A few categories will have the prize displayed with the entry. Prizes not collected by $4: 30$ pm on Saturday, September $7^{\text {th }}$ will be forfeited.
10. All entries MUST BE REMOVED ONLY between $3: 30$ pm and $4: 30 \mathrm{pm}$ on Saturday, September $7^{\text {th }}$. NO EARLIER THAN 3:30 pm. NO EXCEPTIONS.
11. The Rocky View Chestermere Ag. Society is NOT RESPONSIBLE for any articles left on the grounds or in the facilities after 5:00 pm on Saturday, September $7^{\text {th }}$.
12. All entries remain the property of the exhibitor. Any entry remaining after the show will be disposed of at the discretion of the committee.

## Judging and Prizes

1. Trophies and some special prizes will be awarded on Fair Day Saturday, September $7^{\text {th }}$ at $3: 00 \mathrm{pm}$ in the curling rink. Numerous donor prizes, which are not indicated, will be distributed at the discretion of the Red Ribbon Committee.
2. Cash prizes or other prizes (EXCLUDING RIBBONS AND EXHIBITS) may be claimed anytime from 11:00 am to 4:30 pm on Saturday, September $7^{\text {th }}$ at the Red Ribbon Front Desk in the curling rink.
3. Competition judging starts Friday, September $6^{\text {th }}$ at $6: 30 \mathrm{pm}$ at the Chestermere Recreation Centre for all Sections of the Red Ribbon Competition.
4. Trophies - The Family Grand Aggregate Trophy will be awarded to the family with the most overall points in ALL classes of the Red Ribbon Competition. Trophies are also awarded for the most points in each Section. Points will be awarded as follows: First Place = 3 points, Second Place $=2$ points and Third Place $=1$ point. The name of the winning family or individual and the year of competition will be added to the trophies on permanent display at the Chestermere Rec Centre. Personal trophies will be presented to the winning families and individuals on Fair Day.
5. First, second and third-place ribbons will be awarded to all classes in the Red Ribbon Competition.
6. All categories will be judged by qualified and experienced judges chosen by the Red Ribbon Committee.
7. The Chestermere area school with the most student entries in this year's competition will be awarded certificate and glass trophy.
8. Other prizes may be awarded, but have not been confirmed at the time of printing this booklet. Please watch our website and FaceBook page for additional prize announcements.

## Bring your best and fastest zucchini! Wheels and axels provided.

Register and pick up your wheel/axle kit at the Chestermere Public Library beginning in August 2024.

There are four classes:

- Under 10,
- Over 10,
- Seniors (65+), and
- 'Bring Your Own Wheels' Class.

Please meet at 12:00 noon September 7 ${ }^{\text {th }}$, 2024 in the Curling Rink. Races begin at 12:30pm.

GENERAL RULES: Courtesy Bears Paw Olde Thyme Fair All cars must start by gravity from a standstill, at the starting point. No pushing is allowed. To finish, the car whose nose is the first to cross the finish line is the winner. The race official(s) will decide the winner, and if the result is too close to call, a second race will be run. If any car leaves the track the race can be restarted. If the same car leaves again, the car is eliminated.


## VEHICLE SPECIFICATIONS:

WIDTH: Overall width of wheels is not to exceed 9.5 cm . The minimum distance between the wheels is 5 cm . The maximum distance between wheels is 7 cm (This is ensuring your car stays on the track!)
LENGTH: Overall length is not to exceed 25 cm .
HEIGHT: Clearance between the chassis and the track should be a minimum of .95 centimeters or $3 / 8$ th of an inch. RESTRICTIONS: The car shall not ride on springs. Details and attachments should be added providing they are securely fastened and do not exceed the maximum length, and width specifications. Vehicles are subject to inspection by an official inspection committee to determine eligibility and safety. Non secure decorations may be removed by judges.

## BUILDING GUIDELINES:

1. The vehicles should be built by the racer. Adult supervision is allowed for racers under 10 years of age.
2. Vehicles should be constructed using a whole or freshly carved zucchini. Mouldy cars will be disqualified.
3. Vehicles should either have wheels securely attached through the zucchini body or have the zucchini securely attached to a wheeled platform. Make sure that the overall size of the car meets the requirements.
4. Wheel/axel kits will be available before the races; or from The Chestermere Public Library 105b Marina Road, Chestermere in early August.
5. Decorate your vehicle! Have fun! After all, this is what it is all about.
6. Measure your car!

Cars will be raced based on registration number. (Racer 1 will race 2; racer 3 will race 4, etc.). All racers should present themselves and their car 20 minutes prior to race time. Tables will be available for inspected cars to await their race. Judges decision will be final.
